SUMMARY OF PROFESSIONAL CAREER

I am a Registered Medical Practitioner on the GMC Specialist Register and the Medical Register of the Republic of Ireland with Licence to Practise.

I was appointed Consultant Surgeon in 1992 and since 2018 have held a Honorary Consultant appointment at the Great Western Hospital NHS Foundation Trust.

I am a graduate of the Birmingham Medical School (1979), having previously completed an honours degree course in Physiology and Biochemistry (Hatfield, 1975). I commenced postgraduate surgical training in Newcastle upon Tyne, gaining Surgical Fellowships (FRCS) from both the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and of England (1983).
